

Inconsistent Tenses in Content Writing

Inconsistent tenses occur when writers shift between past, present, or future tenses within the same sentence or paragraph, leading to confusion and lack of clarity.

Common Errors

Mixing past and present tenses in the same narrative.

- Incorrect: 'She was writing the article and decides to take a break.'
- Correct: 'She was writing the article and decided to take a break.'

Changing tenses without a clear reason.

- Incorrect: 'I will finish the report yesterday.'
- Correct: 'I finished the report yesterday.'

How to Correct It

- **Stay consistent:** Ensure the tense remains the same throughout a paragraph unless there's a clear need to change it (e.g., flashback, change in time).
- **Proofread carefully:** Pay attention to verb tense consistency during revisions.
- **Practice:** Regular writing exercises focusing on tense consistency help develop a natural flow and eliminate tense errors.

Examples

- Incorrect: 'He walks to the office and called his boss.'
- Correct: 'He walked to the office and called his boss.'

- Incorrect: 'She eats breakfast and went to the meeting.'
- Correct: 'She ate breakfast and went to the meeting.'
